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I'll tell you, man. It's that scary here. Yeah.

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It's like if you put a nuclear button next to a monkey. It's like-

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How did you get started in art? Art being everything. Music, and all the different media you've worked in.

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I've never heard that quote from her before.

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With your creative work along this line, how do you define success? And how do you define failure?

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Is there a system you use when you're creating? A self-made system?

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You've always worked outside of the regular "industry"; in creating and disseminating your art and music, what would you count as the most valuable resources? For some people that's having access to a studio, or it's instruments, or it's other people, or channels for distribution.
